2 ENROLLED, House Joint Resolution,
3 COMMENDING THE FAIRFIELD HIGH SCHOOL JOBS FOR
4 ALABAMA'S GRADUATES (JAG) PROGRAM.
5

6 WHEREAS, the Jobs for America's/Alabama's Graduates
7 (JAG) program is currently the nation's largest school-to-work
8 transition program, having programs in 36 states in the United
9 States and the United Kingdom; and

10 WHEREAS, there are only 25 JAG sites in the State of
11 Alabama, and Fairfield High Preparatory School hosts the only
12 JAG program in Jefferson County; and

13 WHEREAS, the ultimate goal of the JAG program is to
14 graduate young adults equipped with the skills necessary to
15 successfully compete in today's workforce; Fairfield High
16 Preparatory's JAG graduates have gone on to make their mark in
17 the world by attending postsecondary schools, enlisting in the
18 military, or by directly entering into the professional
19 workforce; and

20 WHEREAS, the skills taught in the JAG program
21 directly correlate with the requirements of the Alabama Course
22 of Study, and for the most part, encompass the content of the
23 Alabama High School Graduation Exam; since its inception at
24 Fairfield High Preparatory, the overall graduation rate has
25 increased from 80 to 96 percent; and

1 WHEREAS, an additional component to the JAG program,
2 the student-led Career Association is an elite organization
3 with formal inductions of members both at the state and
4 national level; through involvement in this association,
5 students are able to participate in various community service
6 projects, compete in district and state JAG events, and
7 whenever possible, engage in job shadowing experiences
8 relative to their prospective career choices; and

9 WHEREAS, the JAG program at Fairfield High
10 Preparatory School has received numerous awards and both state
11 and national recognition; the prestigious roster of students
