> > Absentee Ballots - Elections - Candidates - Ballots

The Code of Alabama does not prohibit a candidate or an individual from obtaining and distributing absentee ballot applications.

Dear Mrs. Steindorff:

Our office received an opinion request from you concerning the following matter:

- "1. Can a candidate for election pick up absentee ballot applications from the Register or Clerk, and if so, how many is he entitled to have?
- 2. Can he pick up individual applications or is he entitled to a book of applications?
- 3. How many applications is an individual not a candidate entitled to have?"

In answer to your questions, the Code of Alabama does not prohibit a candidate or an individual from obtaining and distributing absentee ballot applications. The only restriction the Code places on such applications is that they be returned to the register or the clerk either by hand or by U.S. mail.

In response to your quantitative question the Attorney General is of the opinion that a candidate or an individual would be entitled to a reasonable amount of applications. This would be strictly discretionary with the individual clerks and registers.
