(1)	FY 2012 BUDGETED and FY 2013 GOVERNOR RECOMMENDED require that at least 30% of workforce development funds be recommended by the Workforce Departmental Review Committee for programs in the 23 counties with the highest unemployment rates in the state; these programs are not subject to review and approval by the State Workforce Planning Council.
(2)	FY 2012 BUDGETED, FY 2013 GOVERNOR RECOMMENDED, FY 2013 SENATE PASSED, FY 2013 HOUSE PASSED and FY 2013 ENACTED require that at least \$900,000 of Career Tech funds be used for Agriscience purposes, with the remainder expended for other career tech programs.
(3)	FY 2012 BUDGETED, FY 2013 GOVERNOR RECOMMENDED, FY 2013 SENATE PASSED, FY 2013 HOUSE PASSED and FY 2013 ENACTED include legislative intent that these funds be "expended for Alabama residents."
(4)	FY 2012 BUDGETED allows DHR to use up to \$4,800,000 of unspent Food Stamp Program administrative funds for subsidized child care, with any remainder reverting to the Education Trust Fund.
